Establishing a Neighborhood Crime Watch



A strong deterrent to crime in our city is neighborhood action. The crime prevention steps you and your neighbors take as a group are just as important as the things you do on your own in deterring burglary,theft,vandalism and other crimes. Crime Watch is a cooperative effort between the police and individual neighborhoods.

Benefits of Having a Crime Watch

- Getting to know your neighbors who will "watch out" for your neighborhood.
- Receiving neighborhood crime alerts.
- Posting Crime Watch signs to let criminals know you are involved.

Crime Watch last fall.

- Neighbors more likely to watch your home/report suspicious activity.
- Possible home insurance discounts.
- Safety information provided by the Police Department to help make your home and neighborhood safer.

How to Get Started

- Find out the interest level in your neighborhood this can be done by talking with neighbors or distributing preformatted informational letters provided by the Police Department.
- Work with the Police Department to define the area of your Crime Watch this is generally a two or three block area, keeping in mind that participation of at least 50 percent of neighbors within the planned watch area is expected.
- Arrange a meeting date with a Police Department crime prevention specialist and neighbors.
- Try to determine if there are specific neighborhood issues and communicate them to law enforcement in advance of meeting.
- Plan on a one hour presentation with time for questions after.
- Notify neighbors 7 to 10 days in advance of the meeting date.

Preserve Boulevard Changes

Improvements/Road changes on Preserve Boulevard between the Eden Prairie Center and Anderson Lakes Parkway are continuing to be reviewed by the City of Eden Prairie. Basic improvements will be for two continuous lanes southbound, additional left turn lanes at northbound intersections, a roadway median and pedestrian access improvements at the intersection with Prairie Center Drive. Based on a city presentation it is our understanding this project is likely to be under construction in 2018. The City has conducted several open house sessions for all those interested and has gathered feedback about this project. At this time they are meeting with property owners that will be directly or indirectly impacted, including the Preserve Association. They are continuing to fine tune this project and will take the preliminary plan to the City Council for approval at a later date.

POOL SEASON OPENS MEMORIAL WEEKEND –May 27, 28, 29 OPEN DAILY BEGINNING JUNE 13-SEPTEMBER 4

The pool will open weekends (Saturday/Sunday) starting Memorial Day Weekend (to include Monday, May 29). It will open daily starting Tuesday, June 13 at noon for the season. Pool tags are now available for members at the Preserve Center. All association members <u>must</u> pick up new tags for each person living in the household each year to gain admission to the pool and the tennis courts. Guests accompanying Preserve members pay a fee of \$3 per child under age 18 and \$5 for adults.

Best outdoor swim lessons in Town!

Children 3 thru Pre-kindergarten 5 years old will be in the *Preschool Aquatic* Program. Ages Postkindergarten 5 year olds and up will be in the *Learn to Swim* Program. Full details online or at the office on swim lesson policies.

Each <u>nine-lesson</u> session runs Monday through Friday in week one and Monday through Thursday in week two. This allows for a makeup class on the last Friday if needed <u>(Make-up only if classes cancelled for 2</u> weather related days).

The city swim sessions are for eight classes and 40 minutes vs. our 45 minutes.

Class fee: \$62 per session for members/\$70 per session for non-members

Registration: <u>Priority to Preserve members beginning April 1.</u> April 25th open to the general public.
