### **Reminders:**

<u>Grass clippings:</u> When mowing, please avoid blowing grass clippings on to the street. Nitrogen that is beneficial to lawns is a product of the clippings, that nitrogen can get into local storm systems, streams and rivers. Help keep our water ways clean by not blowing yard debris and clippings into the streets.

<u>Pool Cards:</u> You must have a pool card to enter the pool. If you have misplaced yours, a replacement card can be purchased in the office for \$15.00 during regular business hours.

<u>Selling Your Home:</u> Contact the Preserve Office. The new homeowner must be provided a resale disclosure certificate and dues current letter as well as association documents prior to closing. If you live in a town house or condo, you are part of two separate HOA's and BOTH need be contacted by your realtor. Please have your realtor contact cindy@preserveassociation.com to get the documents needed.

**Design Review form:** Anything done to the outside of your home must be approved by our design review committee. A form can be found on our website at www.preserveassociation.com (residents, information for buying and selling properties) or by contacting The Preserve. <u>Preserve Party Room</u>: To date, we have had over 40 parties, numerous meetings and events held in the Barn. Rates and rules can be found on our website, contact cindy@preserveassociation.com to see if your date is available.

<u>Guest Passes:</u> The Preserve wants you to have a great summer at the pool. Everyone that lives in The Preserve has been given 12 guest passes added to their household. This is per household not per person. If you bring a guest to the pool, please let the pool staff know that you have a guest before they check you in and your guest will be able to enter the pool with you. After the 12 have been used, they can still come in as your guest at \$5.00 for adult and \$3.00 per child.

Beginner 1: Ages 6-12 11:45 am-12:45 pm (Basic techniques and rules of tennis)


Beginner 2: Ages 6-12 1:00 pm-2:00 pm (Basic tennis skills plus volley, game strategy and scoring)
